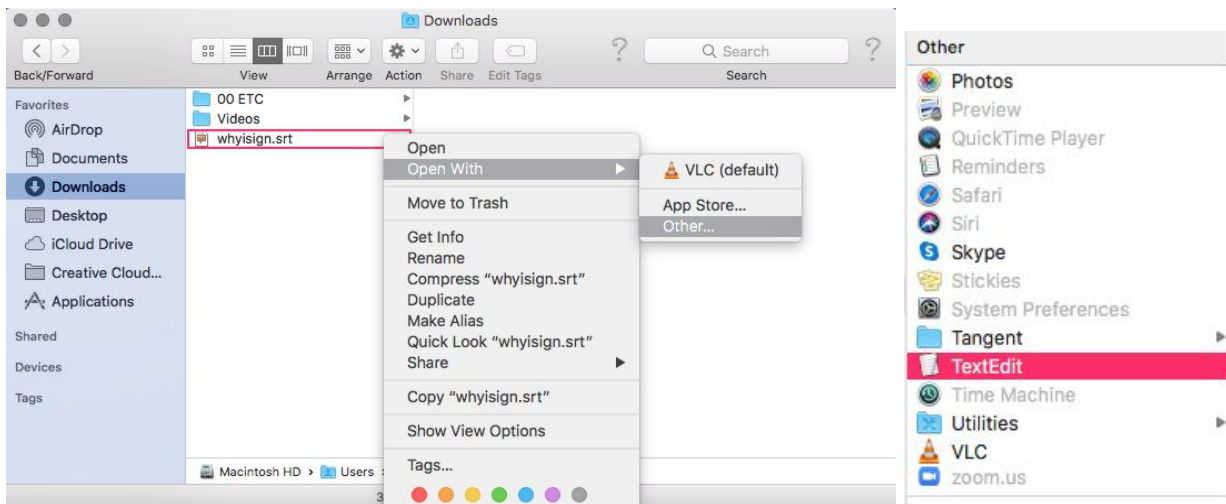


How to edit .srt files

1. Review your captions with VLC ([here's how!](#))
2. If you'd like to make a change, find your .srt in your files, rick click, and find TextEdit.



*TextEdit comes standard with Macs, and can also be downloaded for [Windows](#).

3. Your .srt file will look like this:

To make a change, use your keyboard to type or erase words as needed, then click save. Make sure to avoid making changes to the data in the file, like the line numbers and time codes. This is what makes your captions show up on the screen.

After you make your changes, you can go back to VLC and review your edited .srt file. Congratulations, you have just made edits to your .srt file!
